2	USAF	Prioritized MILCON List		(U) Funding the cost-to-complete (C2C) requests ensures completion of \$90.4M in MILCON previously authorized and appropriated by Congress to construct critical facilities in the UK and AFGSC bases (Kirtland and FE Warren), directly impacting EUJCOM, and STRATCOM missions. The risk of not funding the natural disaster recovery request is an inability to meet a USAF/OCSB commitment and Congressional expectation to recover facilities destroyed by a hurricane at Tynhall AFB. Not funding FHCON at Yokota will cause continued deterioration of dilapidated government-owned housing, increasing risk to the health and safety of military families. Aside from those specific risks, not funding additional MILCON increases risk of facility failures and reduces the capability/capacity of air power projection platforms.
